Ben Wilkerson, Mail Carrier on a rural route, reported to the Commissioners that the County Farm Hill and, also, the road that runs by the farm, is in need of improvement. The hill, particular, he said, was quite dangerous in bad weather. The Board assured him that it would take the matter up with the County Engineer. Ben Babb, City Engineer, J. W. Stone, City Clerk and R. O. Burgert met with the Commissioners to discuss the matter of bringing adjacent properties into the city limits. (The boundary line, as proposed, is outlined on plat in office of the County Engineer.) This was merely a preliminary meeting and not held for the purpose of taking definite action. At this time, the county could offer no objection to the move as planned by the City. (County Engineer and County Attorney, also, present at this meeting.)

In regard to the location of a road, came John Selser, said road to be located between Sections 20 and 29; and Sections 21 and 28. To locate such a road would necessitate the construction of a bridge over Captain Greek. It was suggested by the Board that the Commissioners view this situation to determine the advisability of such a road. (View--informal-Dec. 4 at 2 P.M.)

The County Engineer stated that he wished to secure bids on ten (10) tons of reinforcing bars. Board approved same. Some discussion was given to the advisability of purchasing a paint spray for use of the Bridge crew in painting bridges.

The following cancellation orders were approved by the Board:
