All members of the Board of County Commissioners, namely: Earl T. Black, Chairman, Jas. F. Brass and Chris Schaake, Commissioners, with T. R. Gerhart, County Clerk, met in the regular meeting rooms of said Board for the first meeting of the month.

Salary bills of county employees were presented to the Board, and by formal motion and vote, ordered paid as recorded on the Warrant Register in the office of the county clerk.

Consideration was given to the applications on file for the position of Woodyard Foreman, there having applied: George Tuttle, G. E. McClanahan, Carl Kannenberg, Frank Mallory, J. L. Noleslagel, Harry S. Gregg, and Albert E. Brokmann. After discussion on each application, it was agreed that Harry S. Gregg was the most qualified for the position, whereupon, Chris Schaake moved that Harry S. Gregg be employed as Foreman for the County Woodyard, for the season of 1939-1940 at the salary of \$50.00 per month, said services to begin the 4th day of December, 1939. Jas. F. Brass seconded the motion. On vote, all Commissioners voted "Aye".

Some discussion was given to the writing of Sheriff's deeds as pertaining to the Judicial Tax Sale, with the Sheriff and the County Attorney present.
