No action was taken on the application of J. C. Calhoun, Grant Township, for a beer license to be used at Indian Village due to a technicality of the law prohibiting any manufacturer, distributor, agent or wholesaler to be interested directly or indirectly as an owner or part owner of the premises on which the business is located. In this case, Frank W. McDonald, Distributor, is the owner of the premises upon which the business is located.

Clifford Harding of the Farm Security Office made inquiry as to what compensation the Board had agreed to allow for the services of a stenographer in his office, namely: Irene Carter. On checking the record, it was discovered that action was taken allowing the amount of \$25.00 per month, which was half of a total compensation of \$50.00, \$25.00 to be paid by Franklin County. After giving consideration to this matter, it was moved by Chris Schaake that the Board rescind the action as taken heretofore, and allow, for the month of December, Mrs. Carter's voucher on the basis of \$12.50 per week instead of the total of \$50.00 per month; said wage to be in effect until termination of her services in the Farm Security Office. Jas. F. Brass seconded the motion. On vote, all Commissioners voted in the affirmative.
