January 22, 1940.

On call of the Chairman, Earl T. Black, the Board of County Commissioners met in special session, this 22nd day of January, 1940, all members of said Board and the County Clerk being present.

Harold Beck, Register of Deeds, reported to the Board that the ceiling in his office and in the vault is in need of paint. The Board assured him that it would inspect same. He, also, requested that his deputy's salary be increased from \$75.00 to \$80.00 per month. He was informed that this would be taken under consideration.

Harry Francee, Attorney, gave a report on the K. C. K. V. and Western RR case which is now in court.

Ernest Klooz, abstractor, spoke to the Board in regard to certain property in North Lawrence & Baldwin that should come out of the Judicial Tax Sale, because of duplication on the tax rolls. He was instructed to have the County Attorney draw up the proper papers for the removal.

Papers for the commitment of Mrs. Alice DeWeese to the Topeka State Hospital as a volunteer patient were approved and signed by the Commissioners. Action was taken by proper motion, second, and vote.

At this time, the county board disorganized, whereupon the following motions were made:

Jas. F. Brass moved that Earl T. Black be re-elected as Chairman of the County Board for the year 1940. Chris Schaae seconded the motion. Motion carried by majority vote.

Chris Schaae moved that Jas. F. Brass be re-elected as Vice-chairman of the County Board for the year 1940. Earl T. Black seconded the motion. Motion carried by majority vote.
