The Board of County Commissioners, and the County Clerk met in regular adjourned session.

A delegation, consisting of George Hedrick, Charles Radcliffe, C. B. Holmes, John Brand and Dolph Simons, met with the Board for the purpose of recommending that J. M. Sanderson, be appointed to fill the vacancy left by the death of Chris Schaake, as County Commissioner from the First Distric

Mr. W. L. Hastle, Taxpayer, made the recommendation that Charles Starkweather be considered for the position.

Since the doath of Fr. Schaake, this matter has been given lengthly discussion by the members of the Board and the County Clerk. Applications on file from Chus. Starkweather and E. S. Peckham, and recommendation for J. M. Sanderson were all given consideration. Disposition of same was made in the following action: Jas. F. Brass moved that Fr. J. F. Sanderson be appointed to serve as County Commissioner from the First District, until the next General Election, to fill the vucancy caused by the death of Fr. Chris Schaake. Seconded by County Clerk, T. R. Gorhart. On vote, called by Chairman Earl T. Black, motion carried.

The County Clerk was directed to notify Mr. Sanderson at once.

A rock contract between the county and Mrs. George Hunsinger, presented to the Board by the County Engineer, was signed by the Commissioners.

In regard to the construction of the ditch from Baldwin Creek to the Lake View Club, came a group, consisting of C. A. Karlan, W. G. Dickie, Wesley Brune, E. E. Trueblood and John E. Stephens Milton Beach, the County Attorney, was, also, present. Representatives from the Lake View Club had met with the Beard numerous times before, asking that the county aid them in constructing this ditch. They met with the Beard today, to determine if the county showel could be used on this work. After considerabled discussion, in which the inconvenience of using this equipment and the cost of same, the Club representatives thought it best to hire a private contractor to do the work.

Otto Hack, Clerk of the Willow Springs Township Board and D. L. Burton spoke to the Board in regard to improvements on certain roads in said township so that these roads may be passable in bad weather. As it is now, in bad weather, it is impossible for some school children to travel the roads.

Minutes for the month of January were read and approved as read.

The Board adjourned to meet Wednesday, April 24, 1940.
