The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, with all members and the County Clerk present, met in regular adjourned session.

Judge Frank R. Gray presented the voluntary commitment papers of Lester R. Williams for admission to a state hospital for treatment. After some discussion, Jas. F. Brass moved that Lester R. Williams be accepted as a voluntary commitment patient to a state hospital. J. M. Sanderson seconded the motion. On vote, called by Chairman Black, all commissioners voted "Aye".

Bids for an Adoption Record to be used in the office of the Probate Judge were presented to the Board and opened:

It was moved by Jas. F. Brass that the bid of the Douglas County Republican in the amount of \$35.15 be accepted, same being the low bid. A second was made by J. M. Sanderson. Motion carried by affirmative vote.

At the hour of 2 o'clock P. M., the Board with the County Clerk and Assistant County Engineer met with the Board and Engineer of Johnson County at a designated meeting place to discuss the establishment of a county road in Johnson County which would connect with an extension of the Vinland-Clearfield road in Douglas County, and to discuss the feasibility of Douglas County maintaining the two miles extension of said road in Douglas County.

After said meeting adjourned, the Board reconvened in the regular meeting rooms at the courthouse.

Solon Emery appeared before the Commissioners, asking that certain tax judgments against him be compromised. The Board suggested that he prepare a written Offer of Compromise and present it to the Board.

Adjournment was taken to meet Monday, May 13, 1940.
