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The following Resolution of Application to the Commission of Revenue and Taxation in regard to the additional one mill levy for the Welfare Fund, was passed by unanimous vote.

RESOLUTION OF APPLICATION

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WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, has set up and published a proposed budget for expenditures in the social welfare fund for the purpose of relief of the poor for the year 1941, an amount of \$246,711.00, and such budget of proposed expenditures has been approved by the State Board of Social Welfare;

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AND WHEREAS, the total ad valorem tax requirements necessary to provide such revenue to meet such budget will be \$108,368.70;

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AND WHEREAS, the valuation of Douglas County, Kansas, as of July 1, 1940, is \$36,122,947.00 on which a tax levy of three mills would be necessary to raise \$108,368.70;

AND WHEREAS, on the basis of the ad valorem needs, the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, finds that the one mill tax levy authorized to be levied by the Board of County Commissioners under Sec. 79-1947, G. S. 1935 will produce an insufficient revenue for the care and maintenance of the poor who shall be dependent on the public for support during the fiscal year, January 1, 1941 to December 31, 1941;

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THEREFORE the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, respectfully makes application to the Commission of Revenue and Taxation of the State of Kansas for permission to levy an additional mill as authorized under Sec. 79-1947, G. S. 1935.
