All members of the Board of County Commissioners and the County Clerk met in regular adjourned session.

The Board passed the following Cancellation Order:

No. 196 " CANCEL tax in the amount of \$4.58, based on a valuation of \$235.00, charged to Leaford G. Babcock of LeCompton Township, School District 24-4.

Mr. Babcock was moving into Douglas County at time of assessment in 1939, and Deputy Assessor included a Tractor (value of \$200.00) and a tractor lister (value of \$35.00), which remained in Waubesaunsee County for some time after March 1st.

These items were properly assessed in Waubesaunsee County as of March 1.

Refunding warrant #30, in the amount of \$4.58, is being mailed from this office to Mr. Babcock.
