As per adjournment, all members of the Board of County Commissioners and the County Clerk met in the regular meeting rooms of said Board.

The following Cancellation Order was passed by the Commissioners:

Judge Frank R. Gray presented voluntary commitment papers of Pauline Sommer to the Board for action. The applicant is seeking admission to the state hospital for treatment. After some discussion, Jas. F. Brass moved that said Pauline Sommer's papers be approved and that the Chairman be authorized to sign the necessary agreement. J. M. Sanderson seconded the motion. On vote, all commissioners voted "Aye".

The following orders were passed:

No. 193 "To cancel 1939 Personal Property tax in the amount of \$2.14, based on a valuation of \$60.00, charged in the name of Mrs. F. H. Flickinger in Baldwin City, School District No. 17.

No exemption allowed"

No. 194 "To cancel Personal Property tax in the amount of \$5.81, based on a valuation of \$155.00, charged to Wm. H. Wells, 1341 Ohio, Lawrence, School District No. 60.

Mr. Wells moved to Topeka after he was assessed in Douglas County. He was assessed, also, in Shawnee County for 1939 and has paid the tax there. Shawnee County Treasurer's receipt #1807-\$7.878

The Board adjourned to meet September 19.
