

COMMISSIONER'S RECORD N

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Douglas County Republican, Lawrence

September 19, 1940.

The Board of County Commissioners, with all members and the County Clerk present, convened in its regular meeting room in adjourned regular session.

A Mr. Barnhart, instructor on the Federal Adult Education Project, appeared before the Board to ask for quarters for his classes for about three and one-half weeks, said classes meeting twice a week. It was the thought of the Board that Mr. Barnhart could conduct his classes in the Jury Room, providing no classes were held during court session. The County Clerk was instructed to make arrangements.

Ed Shaw spoke to the Board in regard to a bindweed matter, in which he claims that the bindweed from the land of Carl Hird is spreading to his land, and, that although he is trying to kill said weed, it is impossible to keep it all off his property because of the badly infested land adjacent thereto. It was suggested that both Mr. Shaw and Mr. Hird meet with the Board on the 25th to discuss this matter.

At this time bids for the 1941 Tax Rolls were opened:

It being apparent that the Douglas County Republican is the lowest bidder, Jas. F. Brass moved that the bid of the Douglas County Republican at the price of \$142.50 for four (4) 1941 Tax Rolls, be accepted. J. M. Sanderson seconded the motion. On vote, called by Chairman Black, motion carried by unanimous vote.

Cancellation Order No. 195 was passed:

"To cancel 1939 Personal Property tax in the amount of \$2.62, based on a valuation of \$70.00, charged to Ethel Stewart, Haskell Institute, Lawrence, School District #60.

Assessor failed to give exemption."

The Board adjourned to meet Wednesday, September 25, 1940, at the hour of 8 o'clock A. M.
