

COMMISSIONER'S RECORD N

Douglas County Republican, Lawrence

September 7, 1940.

As per adjournment, all members of the Board of County Commissioners and the County Clerk met in the regular meeting rooms of said Board.

There being present the County Engineer and two representatives of lumber companies, the Board opened the following bids for bridge lumber;

Bids submitted on:

50 pcs 3x12x14'-0"
150 pcs 3x12x16'-0"
300 pcs 3x12x18'-0"
140 pcs 3x12x20'-0"

Specification: All lumber must be of Douglas Fir, full sawn and surfaced one side, and one edge (S1S1E) hit or miss, to uniform dimension of 2-15/16" by 11-15/16", and must conform to the grading requirements of the West Coast Lumber men's Association for No. 1 dimension plank, paragraph No. 195, page 33; and the density requirements of paragraph 301, page 62.

Inspection: Inspection shall be made at the mill by an authorized Inspection Agency, and bidders shall include the cost of inspection in their bid. The successful bidder shall furnish Douglas County with a certificate of inspection.

DO NOT SHIP LUMBER FROM THE MILL WITHOUT INSPECTION.

It was moved by Jas. F. Brass that the bid of the Wheeler Lumber Company, the low bidder, in the amount of \$36.50 M, be accepted. J. M. Sanderson seconded the motion. On vote, called by the Chairman, all Commissioners voted "Aye".

The County Engineer was authorized to issue a Purchase Order as per the above action.

Bids received for tax receipts for the County Treasurer's office, were opened, at this time, the County Treasurer being present at said opening:

J. M. Sanderson moved that the Board accept the bid of the Baldwin Ledger for tax receipt books at the price of \$202.50, they being the low bidder. Jas. F. Brass seconded the motion. On vote, all commissioners voted in the affirmative.

Further claims against the county for wages, materials and supplies and claims from the Welfare Department, were by formal action, paid as per Allowance Record on file in the County Clerk's office.

No further business appearing, the Commissioners adjourned to meet Wednesday, September 11, 1940.

No. 194 "To cancel Personal Property tax in the amount of \$5.81, based on a valuation of \$155.00, charged to Wm. H. Wells, 1341 Ohio, Lawrence, School District No. 60.

Mr. Wells moved to Topeka after he was assessed in Douglas County. He was assessed, also, in Shawnee County for 1939 and has paid the tax there. Shawnee County Treasurer's receipt #1807-\$7.87
