December 21, 1940

At the hour of 1:30 P. M., a majority of the members of the Board of County Commissioners, namely: Earl T. Black, Chairman, and Jas. F. Brass, Commissioner, and County Clerk T. R. Gerhart, met in regular adjourned session.

The following resolution was passed:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Section 79-2422, General Statutes, 1935, grants authority to the Board of County Commissioners to compromise taxes, interest and penalties on any land or lots which have been bought in by the County and which have been unredeemed for at least a period of four years; and

WHEREAS, there now appears G. W. Livengood, owner of the following described property:

S $\frac{1}{2}$ of NW $\frac{1}{4}$, 4-14-20 and N $\frac{1}{2}$ of SW $\frac{1}{4}$, 4-14-20.

on which taxes are due and unpaid for the years 1933, 1934, 1935, 1936, 1937 and 1939, as shown on the tax sale records of Douglas County, and

WHEREAS, it is the wish of the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, to extend to the above owner of the above described property a right to moratorium privileges similar to those provided in Chapter 326, Session Laws of Kansas for 1939.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, that when taxes for the year 1938 and subsequent years have been paid, said above owner may redeem the above described property now appearing on the tax sale books of Douglas County without paying the penalties, costs or expenses, which are hereby remitted, and by paying interest on such back tax at the rate of six per centum per annum from September 1, 1939.

Don Hulst, Attorney, representing S. J. Hunter, John E. Stephens, Acting County Engineer, and Milton P. Beach, Attorney, met with the Board to discuss the four road petitions submitted by said Mr. Hulst, to have roads in West Hills, namely: High Drive, Oxford Road, Sunset Drive and Cambridge Place, declared township roads. A waiver, signed by S. J. Hunter, and a statement signed by the Wakarusa Township Board, are on file with the petitions. The Commissioners wished to take no action on this until the third member of the Board returned.

Refunding Warrant No. 31, in the amount of \$65.55, was ordered paid to Roy Flory, County Treasurer for credit to 1940 tax of Kansas City, Kaw Valley and Western Railroad Company. This is for refund of 1939 tax paid on Receipt No. 44. Duplicate assessment on Lawrence and Corporation tax roll: S $\frac{1}{2}$ of Lot 10 and all of Lot 12, New Hampshire Street. Charge Refunding Warrants.

Refunding Warrant No. 32, in the amount of \$15.01, was ordered paid to Maud Evans and Lucille Underwood for refund on tax paid on S $\frac{1}{2}$ of S $\frac{1}{2}$ of W 16 ft of E 33 ft., Park St., Lot 21. Portion of tax cancelled on account of condemnation for alley purposes. Charge 1940 tax account.

Bids for the furnace for the Sheriff, which were received and opened on December 19, were taken up now for discussion and action. The Bids are in amounts as follows:
