Regular claims against the county for salaries, wages and materials were by proper motion and favorable action, allowed in amounts as recorded on the Allowance Record in the office of the County Clerk.

A beer license was allowed to F. E. Ross, as per the following motion:

<u>RESOLUTION</u>

WHEREAS, on the 2nd day of January, 1941, the same being a regular meeting of the Board of County Commissioners, the application of F. E. Ross for a beer license came on for consideration of said Board, and

WHEREAS, the Board does find that the said F. E. Ross is in all ways qualified under the law to sell cereal malt beverages for consumption on the premises, and

WHEREAS, the Board further finds that a due and legal notice has been given to the Wakarusa Township Eoard, and that written notice of approval, signed by all three members of said, Board, for the issuance of said license has been filed by the Wakarusa Township Board.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the applicant F. E. Ross be granted a license to sell cereal malt beverages for consumption on premises at the place so described in application.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that T. R. Gerhart, County Clerk of Douglas County, be, and he is hereby directed to issue said license.

WHEREAS, Section 79-2422, General Statutes, 1935, grants authority to the Board of County Commissioners to compromise taxes, interest and penalties on any land or lots which have been bought in by the County and which have been unredeemed for at least a period of four years; and

WHEREAS, there now appears Cornelia Hazzard, owner of the following described property:

on which taxes are due and unpaid for the years 1936 and 1937, as shown on the tax sale records of Douglas County, and

WHEREAS, it is the wish of the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, to extend to the above owner of the above described property a right to moratorium privileges similar to those provided in Chapter 326, Session Laws of Kansas for 1939.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, that when taxes for the year 1938 and subsequent years have been paid, said above owner may redeem the above described property now appearing on the tax sale books of Douglas County without paying the penalties, costs or expenses, which are hereby remitted, and by paying interest on such back tax at the rate of six per centum per annum from September 1, 1939.
