At the hour of 2 o'clock P. M., the Board, accompanied by the County Engineer and the County Clerk met in Grant Township at the place of beginning of a road described as: Beginning at a point 316 feet South, and 33 feet East of the NW Corner of Section 7, T12S, R20E, said point being the centerline of old road No. 639, thence Southeasterly along old Road No. 639 to the present West Right of way line of U. S. Highway No. 59 and 24, all in the West one-half of Section 7, T12S, R20E, and terminating at the South line of Section 7, T12S, R20E, for the purpose of viewing said road for vacation of same as prayed for, by petition of Nannie Garvin and twelve (12) others.

The Board returned to the regular meeting rooms at the courthouse for further action. After discussion with the County Engineer, it was moved by Jas. F. Brass that the petition of Nannie Garvin and twelve others for the vacation of a road described above, be accepted, and that the following resolution (Viewers Report) be passed. J. M. Sanderson seconded the motion. On vote, called by Chairman Earl T. Black, all commissioners voted in the affirmative.

V I E W E R S R E P O R T

We, the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, acting as Viewers of a road petitioned for by Nannie Garvin, and others of Grant Township, met, as heretofore determined, and ordered by the Board, at the beginning point of the road as petitioned for to be vacated, on the 6th day of January, 1941, and proceeded to view the route of said road as prayed for in the petition for vacation.

We were met by Mr. Emil Heck, a representative of Grant Township, and others, and after discussion the proposed vacation learned that there were no objectors present, and our final action in the matter is as follows:

FINAL ACTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS ON THE ROAD VACATION PETITIONED FOR BY NANNIE GARVIN AND OTHERS

The petition of Nannie Garvin, and others for the vacation of a road being under consideration of the Board of County Commissioners for final action, it is determined, and ordered by the Board that the public good and convenience does not require that said road right of way remain on the records as a public road, and we hereby determine and order that said road be vacated, and that these proceedings, together with a report of the survey be recorded, and that the Trustee of Grant Township be directed to cause the road closed for public use.
