At the hour of 9 o'clock A. M., all members of the Board of County Commissioners and the County Clerk met in adjourned regular session.

As per appointment Harry Sutton appeared before the Board in regard to operating the Lecompton Well, from which he is desirous of securing his water supply for his cattle. The following Agreement was entered into:

AGREEMENT

This agreement made this 29th day of January, 1941, by and between the Board of County Com-missioners of Douglas County, Kansas, party of the first part and Harry Sutton of Douglas County, Kansas, party of the second part;

Witnesseth, the said party of the first part in consideration of the agreements of the party of the second part, hereinafter stated, agrees to install an electric motor pump at the County well located at the north end of the Lecompton Kaw River bridge of Lecompton Township, and agrees to allow the party of the second part to operate said motor and pump and to use all water that he needs from said well.

In consideration of which the said party of the second part agrees to pay the costs of installing the said pump and motor and to pay for all electricity used in operating said motor and to pay any necessary expenses for repairs to said motor and pump, said party of the second part further agrees to allow the Lacompton school district or any individual residing in Douglas County to use what water they need from said well, provided, however, that said school district or individuals pay the party of the second part a proportionate share of the electricity used.

This contract to be in full force and effect for ninety days from the day hereof, with a further provision that it may be renewed on expiration of the ninety day period by consent of both parties, and in case it should be renewed after the expiration of the ninety day period, the contract may be terminated at any time by ten days' notice given by either party to the other party of the contract.
