February 11, 1941.

All members of the Board of County Commissioners, namely, L. H. Griffith, Chairman, J. M. Sanderson and Ed Johnson, Commissioners and T. R. Gerhart, County Clerk, convened in regular adjourned session this 11th day of February, 1941.

Park Hetzel, Sr., presented a complaint to the Commissioners in regard to the county employees at the county shops washing the cars in the yard and letting this water run down the alley to where the Coca Cola people in the building next to the yards, drive out their trucks. The Coca Cola people are renting this building from Mr. Hetzel and they have told him they plan to rent another building unless something is done about this water situation. Park Hetzel, also, stated that to wash cars in an alley is against a City ordinance. The Board informed him that it would investigate the matter.

Frank Houk and Ben Swallow from Kanwaka Township appeared before the Board in regard to the townships' refund from the Highway Benefit Refund. The townships are asking that the county board support them in protesting the repeal of the Benefit Refund law. The Chairman suggested that the townships get together and send a protest to the Representatives and Senator. The Board of County Commissioners this day sent a letter to the representatives and senator, protesting same.

No further business appearing, the Board adjourned to meet Wednesday, February 12, 1941.

February 12, 1941.

The Board of County Commissioners with all members and the County Clerk present convened in adjourned regular session.

Discussion was given to the purchase of an automobile for the Sheriff's Department, Chas. E. Panning, Sheriff, being present. It was the thought of the Sheriff's force that the 95 H.P. Ford, as per bid of the Williams-Roberts Motor Company, would be the best car for their use.

After scrutinizing the car bids again, the Commissioners thought it best to call for new bids, therefore, Ed Johnson moved that all bids received for an automobile for the Sheriff's Department be rejected and that new bids be called for, to be opened Monday, February 17 at 10 o'clock A. M. J. M. Sanderson seconded the motion. On vote, called by Chairman L. H. Griffith, all commissioners voted "Aye".

John Seiler from the Seiler Roofing Company reported to the Board that the jail roof is badly in need of repair; there is a leak directly over the Sheriff's desk which causes the water to run down on the desk. He advised the best thing to do is to have a new roof put on. The Board asked him to call back later on this.

The Board entered into some discussion in regard to the employment of a Care Taker for the Lone Star Park. After consideration to the qualifications of Harry S. Gregg, applicant, Ed Johnson moved that Harry Gregg be re-employed as Superintendent of the Lone Star Lake at his present salary of \$60.00 per month, appointment to terminate December 31, 1941; that he be allowed 25 gallons of gasoline per month for the use of his car while patrolling the lake and that he reimburse the county \$2.50 per month for electricity used by him. J. M. Sanderson seconded the motion. On vote, all commissioners voted "Aye".

Hector Harding applied for the position of Janitor at the courthouse, since it will be necessary for Harold Wilburn to be away for awhile. The Board said it would take his application under consideration, and would let him know of its decision later.

The Board adjourned to meet Friday, February 14, 1941.
