RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Section 79-2422, General Statutes, 1935, grants authority to the Board of County Commissioners to compromise taxes, interest and penalties on any land or lots which have been bought in by the County and which have been unredeemed for at least a period of four years, and

WHEREAS, there now appears William J. Hawkins, owner of the following described property:

Lot 6, Sinclair's Subdivision, an addition to the City of Lawrence, Kansas,

on which taxes are due and unpaid for the year 1932, 1933, 1936, 1937, 1938 and 1939 as shown on the tax sale records of Douglas County, and

MIEREAS, it is the wish of the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, to extend to the above owner of the above described property a right to moratorium privileges similar to those provided in Chapter 326, Session Laws of Kansas for 1939.

NCW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Cormissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, that when taxes for the year 1938 and subsequent years have been paid, said above owner may redeen the above described property now appearing on the tax sale books of Douglas County without paying the penalties, costs or expenses, which are hereby remitted, and by paying interest on such back tax at the rate of six per centum per annum from September 1, 1939.

For the first meeting of the month, all members of the Board and the County Clerk met in the regular meeting rooms of said Board.

Bill Jacobs, formerly employed by the county as bridge foreman, placed a vertal application before the Commissioners for another position with the county. He stated that he was 72 years of age and had been unable to find work since he was discharged from his job with the county. The Board informed him that it would keep him in mind, but at the present time no work is available.

Mr. and Mrs. Daniel H. Spencer and their agent Clyde E. Hosford mot with the Board for the purpose of requesting that a sewer district be formed within the boundaries of certain real estate located in Section 1. Township 13. Range 19, said land which is now owned by the Spencers. Charline Fitzpatrick and E. Y. Cameron. This proposed sewer district is adjacent to a sewer serving District No. 1. They are asking that the portion of the main sewer serving Sewer District No. 1 from its connection with the Lawrence city sewer system be constituted as a joint sewer. The owners of the land in the proposed district will pay all the cost incident to the establishment and construction of the sewer system, which will in turn be paid back to the owners of property in Sewer District No. 1.

John Brand, representing I. C. Bushong, was also present during the discussion. No action was taken at this time.

Regular monthly bills for salaries, wagos and materials were minutelyinspected by the Hoard and passed as recorded on the Allowance Record in theoffice of the county clerk.

Clarence Maichel spoke to the Commissioners in regard to pumping water from the Maichel Well. The engine has been removed and is stored at the county shops. He wondered if the Board would allow him to connect his own engine on this and pump water for himself. Since his cistern has gone dry, he is in need of this water.

The matter of appointing a bindweed supervisor for the year 1941 was brought up for discussion, and final action was taken as follows:

J. N. Sanderson moved that Asa R. Colman be appointed as Bindweed Supervisor of Douglas County for the period from Earch 1, 1941 to December 31, 1941, and that he receive the compensation of \$4.00 per day. Ed Johnson seconded the motion. On call of Chairman L. H. Griffith, the commissioners voted as follows:
