Strode, Fred Taylor, Fred E. Johnson and Ed Harvey. Fred Taylor stated that he did not think this job should pay under \$80.00 per month. He said further that at one time he was offered this job at \$90.00 per month but on applying for work, discovered that the job had been given to another man. Ed Harvey said that they wanted fair play--that this job was worth at least \$90.00 per month. Several other members of the delegation spoke in favor of an increase for Georgie. Hugo Schott from L'arion Township requested that the county improve the road running by his property in Section 2-15-18. He said that they, also, needed a bridge over the creek.
