After several bids for a tractor for the county farm were considered, the Board took final action on the purchase of same by unanimously passing the following resolution:

<u>RESOLUTION</u>

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, desire to purchase from E. S. Dillon, one John Deere tractor, one tractor cultivator and one tractor plow, valued net at \$540.00, and

WHEREAS, the said E. S. Dillon agrees to take off oxchange therefor, four cows and five horses, now owned by Douglas County and located on the County Farm, the value of which is set by the Board of County Commissioners at \$540.00.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED that the Superintendent of the County Farm deliver the said livestock and accept the said machinery in accord with the provision of the sale contract on file in the County Clerk's office, and

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED that the inventories be adjusted to show exchange of said property on the basis of equal values without exchange of cash.
