Mr. Bliesner gave a bid on a reconditioned 18 inch carriage Royal typewriter for \$35.00 and a factory rebuilt 12 inch carriage machine for \$60.00.

J. M. Sanderson moved that the county purchase one reconditioned 18 inch carriage typewriter at the price of \$35.00, same to be used in the Engineering Department and one factory rebuilt 12 inch machine at \$60.00, to be used in the Welfare Department. L. H. Griffith seconded the motion. On vote, motion carried.

Art Weaver, George Hedrick and Milton P. Beach met with the Board to discuss the disposition of the buildings at the Lone Star Park.

John Molsker, Superintendent of the County Farm presented bids for linoleum for three rooms at the county farm. The rooms are kitchen, pantry and washroom. The bids are as follows:

Ramsey's: Furnish and lay the three rooms direct to wood floor with heavy weight marble, inlaid, 1/8" gauge, including metal in doors. - - - \$113.10

Will furnish and lay the three rooms cemented over linoleum felt with heavy weight inlaid marble linoleum 1/8" gauge, including metal in doors. - - - \$120.80.

Weaver's: Certain patterns other than marble, cemented over felt, metal edgings in doors for \$135.00

Patterns in marble, cemented over felt, metal edgings in doors for \$147.00.
All 1/8" heavy weight.

Price does not include removal of old linoleum. \$8.50 extra for removing old linoleum.

Furn. Co. This bid includes sanding of floors but not to include labor or material necessary to put floor in proper condition other than sanding.

Heavy gauge, Marbelles or Veltones - - - \$155.33

Medium gauge, Marbelles or Veltones - - - \$156.51

1/8" Battleship Linoleum, Plain colors: - - - \$141.40.

Ward & Co.: 1/8" linoleum to be laid cemented and felted to floor of kitchen, pantry and wash room.

1/8" Marble or Tile Pattern - - - \$199.50

1/8" Battleship, Brown, Black, Green or Gray - - - \$123.63

1/8" Jaspé Linoleum Dk. green, Lt Brown, Green or gray - - - \$129.38

Labor on sanding floor (if necessary) additional \$20.00.

J. M. Sanderson moved that we purchase from Ramsey's at \$120.80, bid price, linoleum to be cemented over linoleum felt, including metal for doors, to be used in the kitchen, pantry and wash room at the county home. L. H. Griffith seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Undersheriff Iathrop Read, Jr. brought up the matter of a voucher for an analysis for a blood test made by a Mr. Miller in the office of Dr. Sherwood at the University of Kansas. The bill against the county was for \$50.00, however, the law says that the University cannot make a charge against the county for this. Read says that most of this work was done by the Miller boy on his own time, and he recommended that something be paid for his services. He recommended \$20.00. The Board agreed to pay Mr. Miller \$20.00 for this work.
