his property known as Lot 5, Block 15, Cranson's Sub-Div, said lot being assessed for \$450.00 plus \$4350.00 for improvements. After this property was viewed by the Board, the improvements were reduced \$350.00, making the total valuation \$4450.00.

A former appeal of W. C. Ellis for a reduction on the assessment of his properties, described as Lot 4, Block 11, Eabcock's Enlarged Addition, assessed at 31080.00 plus \$6485.00 for improvements, making a total of \$7565.00; and the N 50' of Lot 5, Block 11, Babcock's Enlarged Addition, assessed for \$720.00 plus \$3785.00 for improvements, making a total of \$4505.00, was acted on by the Board. The Board viewed this property and agreed to reduce the improvements on Lot 4 \$485.00. It was the opinion of the Board that the improvements on the North 50 feet of Lot 5 were not assessed out of line with other properties.

The Board took action on the former appeal of Lillian B. Peirce, 800 Ohio Street. Lrs. Peirce has asked for a reduction on the valuations of her properties known as the S_1^1 of Lot 94 and all of Lot 96, Ohio Street. The S_{Ξ}^{1} of Lot 94 is assessed at \$200.00 and Lot 96 is assessed at \$\$500.00. The value of this property is greatly reduced by a storm sewer running thru same, which makes it a bad location for wilding. The Board reduced the S_{2}^{1} of Lot 94 \$150.00 and Lot 96 \$400.00. In addition to this, a reduction of \$100.00 was made on the N 5' of Lot 92, leaving the lot valuation on the tax rolls in the amount of \$40.00. This adjustment was made due to the removal of a garage from this property.

The Board adjourned until June 9, when they will sit for the final session of the County Board of Equalization.
