

COMMISSIONER'S RECORD N

Douglas County Republican, Lawrence

August 27, 1941.

In regular adjourned session, all members of the Board of County Commissioners and the County Clerk convened in the regular meeting rooms of said Board.

Charles and Fred Rumsey met to discuss the charge for ambulance service. The Board decided to take this matter up with Mildred Watson, County Director.

The Commissioners agreed to let the NYA Personnel Service use the room in the basement of the courthouse for office quarters. This room is now being used by the driver's license clerks. Ed Coffman from the Area office in Topeka, made a verbal request for such quarters.

The Board passed the following resolution in regard to the Enterprise Road:

RESOLUTION

Whereas, The present Enterprise road has no direct connection with any County road, necessitating the dead haul of maintenance equipment, and

Whereas, The householders and Landowners, in and around the Southwest corner of the county desire an all weather road connecting State Highway 50 to the County Twin Mound Road, and

Whereas, By returning the South three miles of the Lone Star section of County road to Marion Township,

Therefore be it resolved by

The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, State of Kansas, in regular session assembled this 27th day of August, 1941, do grant the addition of the following described township road to the County System of Highways,

Beginning at the quarter point of the South line of Section #36, Township 14 S, Range 17E, thence in a Northerly direction to a point on the North line of Section #24, Township 14S, Range 17E, thence West on the Section line approximately one quarter mile, thence northwesterly to Section line between Section 13 and 14, thence North on Section line to the Northwest corner of Section 13, Township 14S, Range 17 E, also point in County Road, point of ending.

and further

Resolved, That the present section of County road known as Lone Star road,

Beginning at the Southwest corner of Section 32, Township 14S, Range 18E, thence North 3 miles and terminating at the Northwest corner of Section 20, Township 14S, Range 18E,

be returned to Marion Township.

With Herman Cohen, the Board again discussed the compromise of personal property tax judgments against him. The Board finally agreed to compromise as per the following resolution:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the matter of an offer to compromise personal property tax judgments against Herman Cohen has been considered by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas; said tax judgments are recorded in the name of James H. Rogers and Rogers Vending Machine Company in Judgment Docket No. Eight (8), Page Two Hundred Forty-one (241), in the office of the Clerk of the District Court of Douglas County, Kansas. Said judgments covering taxes for the years 1938 and 1939 are as follows:

THEREUPON, the said Board, being duly advised in the premises, finds that it would be to the best interest of Douglas County to compromise the total amount due on said tax lien judgments for the sum of Fifty-nine and 52/100 Dollars (\$59.52), said sum for tax judgment, exclusive of interest and penalties.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, that the offer to compromise said tax lien judgments against Herman Cohen be and the same is hereby accepted, and it is ordered by the said Board that the Clerk of the District Court of Douglas County, Kansas, accept the sum of Fifty-nine and 52/100 Dollars (\$59.52) in full satisfaction of these tax judgments.
