SAID PARTY OF THE SECOND part further agrees to assume any liability for damages which might arise during and in connection with the use and occupation of the said building during the term of this lease and hereby relieves the said party of the first part from any such liability.

THE PARTY OF THE SECOND part further agrees that the building and grounds will be used solely for recreational and other non-commercial purposes.

THE PARTY OF THE FIRST part further agrees that at all times during the operation of this lease, they will provide a right of way from the grounds to a public highway.

Roy Flory, County Treasurer, spoke to the Board about a bid on a Royal Typewriter, which he may purchase for the net price of \$102.06 from the Lawrence Typewriter Exchange. Ten per cent discount (\$23.94) has been allowed on this. The Treasurer said this would be paid out of the Auto Fee Fund.

It was moved by Ed Johnson that the County Treasurer be allowed to purchase one (1) Royal typewriter from the Lawrence Typewriter Exchange at the net price of \$102.06, to be paid out of the Auto Fee Fund. (Ten percent discount allowed on original price.) A second was made by J. M. Sanderson. On vote, motion carried.

County Clerk Gerhart talked to the Commissioners about purchasing the election supplies for the 1942 Primary and General Elections. Due to the difficulty in getting paper etc. it was thought best to place this order as soon as possible, and because of the low figure offered by the Journal World, the contract was let to them as per the following motion: Ed Johnson moved that the contract for the 1942 election supplies for both the Primary and General elections, be let to the Journal World at their price of a total of \$250.00 for the Primary and \$275.00 for the General Election. J. M. Sanderson seconded the motion. On vote, all commissioners voted "Aye".
