WHEREAS it is provided in Chapter 316, Laws of Kansas 1941, that the governing body of any municipality by resolution is hereby authorized and empowered to transfer, annually, from the road, bridge or street fund of such municipality not to exceed twenty-five per cent of the amount of money credited to any such fund, and subject to legal expenditures in such year to a special road, bridge or street building machinery and equipment fund;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners in Douglas County, Kansas, that \$4500.00 Four Thousand Five Hundred Dollars be set aside from the Road and Bridge Fund and be credited to the Road Machinery and Equipment Fund and that a copy of this Resolution be filed with the Treasurer of Douglas County in accord with the provisions of the law. Adopted this 31st day of December, 1941.
