RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Sec. 79-2801, 1941 Supplement provides that the Board of County Commissioners shall direct the County Attorney to file a foreclosure suit and sell all tracts, lots and pieces of real estate on which the taxes have been delinquent for more than four years;

AND WHEREAS, there are numerous tracts, lots and pieces of real estate on the tax rolls of Douglas County, Kansas, upon which the taxes have been delinquent for more than four years;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the County Attorney of Douglas County, Kansas, is hereby ordered to proceed with the foreclosure and judicial sale of the above mentioned tracts, lots and pieces of real estate as provided by law, and to institute and carry out to completion the said proceeding.

The above Resolution was presented and discussed by members of the Douglas County board, and on the 11th day of February, 1942, it was moved by Mr. Johnson and seconded by Mr. Sanderson that the Resolution be adopted. The Resolution was carried by a unanimous vote.

Irving Hill talked with the Board about a plan to beautify the Lone Star Park and Lake.

Representing The Journal World, appeared Ernest Pontius, asking that the County award the printing for 1942 to this company. He stated that the legal rate for printing is \$1.00 per square but that for the county, the company would charge 75%. He, also, stated that it isn't the monetary phase but the service to the public which interests the Journal World in being the official county paper. Mr. Pontius believes that the Journal World should have all the printing or none; they are not interested in a plan whereby all the newspapers in the county would participate in the county printing.

The Commissioners entered into detailed discussion concerning the awarding of the county printing for the year 1942 and finally deemed the fairest and best plan is the distribution of said printing so that all newspapers in the county would benefit by it. However, since the refusal of the Journal World to participate in such a plan, no printing was allowed to them.

J. M. Sanderson moved that the official printing for the county for 1942 be awarded as set out in the following plan. Ed Johnson seconded the motion. On vote, called by Chairman Griffith, all commissioners voted "Aye".

The Outlook is to print the Bills Allowed, which list is published monthly.

The Baldwin Ledger is to print all other legal publications, such as road notices, etc.

The Lawrence Democrat is to print the delinquent tax list.

The Register of Deeds informed the Commissioners that he is in need of more shelving for his office on which to store his records.

The Board adjourned to meet again Wednesday, February 18, 1942.

All members of the Board and the County Clerk met this 18th day of February, in regular adjourned session.

Bill Broeker, again appeared before the Board, asking that the county rock a certain portion of road leading to a cemetery, known as the Rock Creek Cemetery. He says that the road is so bad that he is unable to get into the cemetery when the weather is bad. He agreed to pay his share of the cost of rocking. The Board called in E. E. Larson, the County Engineer, and it was finally agreed that the county would do the rocking--probably about twelve yards of rock--and then half of the cost would be billed to Mr. Broeker and half to the township.

The Board passed favorably on the following beer resolution:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, on the 18th day of February, 1942, the same being a regular adjourned meeting of the Board of County Commissioners, the application of C. G. Hesse, President of the Lawrence Country Club, for a beer license came on for consideration of said Board, and

WHEREAS, the Board does find that the said C. G. Hesse is in all ways qualified under the law to sell cereal malt beverages for consumption on the premises, and

WHEREAS, the Board further finds that due and legal notice has been given to the Wakarusa Township Board and that ten days have expired from the giving of said notice, and that no written objection has been filed by the Wakarusa Township Board, protesting the granting of a beer license.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the applicant C. G. Hesse, President of the Lawrence Country Club, be granted a license to sell cereal malt beverages for consumption on premises at the place so described in application.
