As per adjournment, all members of the Board of County Commissioners and the County Clerk met in regular adjourned session this 11th day of March, 1942.

A. Lawrence and Chris Kraft met with the Board and the County Engineer in regard to securing trucks from the county to be used in the scrap iron drive of the Boy Scouts. The Board agreed that the Boy Scouts would be allowed the use of the county trucks for this one-day drive on March 21; and left the matter in the hands of the County Engineer for him to make further arrangements.

The following bids for the linoleum for the office of the Probate Judge, were received and opened:

Miller Furniture Company: Furnish 3/16" Brown Battleship linoleum, after floor has been repaired and the entire floor sanded for the sum of \$129.50.

Ramsey's: Furnish 3/16" Battleship Linoleum for \$110.75 or 1/8" Battleship Linoleum for \$97.25.

Weaver's: Furnish Armstrong's Battleship linoleum (brown), 3/16", over Armstrong's asphalt saturate felt lining, both securely cemented to floor. Linoleum contractor to have floor sanded and repaired in fit condition to receive linoleum--for \$100.50.

In view of the fact that Weaver's presented the low bid, J. M. Sanderson moved that the bid of Weaver's for the furnishing of linoleum for the Probate Judge's office as specified in the foregoing bid, in the amount of \$100.50, be accepted. With the proper second and vote, motion carried.

The Commissioners went on record as desiring, since we are now in an emergency area, to cooperate with the City of Lawrence in establishing a County Health Unit.
