the recommendation of the County Treasurer that the County retain Mr. Klooz in this capacity until after the sale was over.

Again, bids for the tax rolls, were opened by the Board:

The Allen Press: Three-quarters bound canvas covers (full white canvas with red leather corners.) complete--\$150.50. Also: Full Red Russia with white canvas covers (This is same as 1940 and 1941.) complete--\$166.50.

The World Co.: Specifications as that of the 1940 Tax Rolls. \$142.00.

The Outlook: As per specifications--\$158.50.

Saml Dodsworth Stationery Co.: Same as former bid \$198.00.

After due consideration, it was moved by J. M. Sanderson that the Board accept the bid of the Allen Press at the price of \$150.50 for furnishing four (4) 1942 tax rolls as per specifications submitted. Ed Johnson seconded the motion. On vote, called by Chairman Griffith, all Commissioners voted in favor of the motion.

Ralph Pine talked to the Board about setting up the County Health Unit in this county. The Commissioners have already gone on record as desiring to cooperate with the City of Lawrence in setting up such a unit, due to the fact that we are now in an emergency area and the health situation is of primary importance.

M. D. Flory and Elmer Ousdahl, members of the local rationing board, met with the Board to discuss moving into new quarters and the possibility of dispensing with Rationing Boards No. 3, 4, and 5.

The County Engineer, E. E. Larson, recommended to the Commissioners that the salary of Mildred Nelson, stenographer in his department, be increased from \$60.00 to \$70.00 per month for the Road and Bridge Fund and that she receive an additional \$5.00 per month for stenographic services for the Bindweed fund. After some discussion, the Board finally agreed that said Mildred Nelson is to receive \$70.00 per month for her regular work in the Engineering Department and in addition thereto the sum of 25¢ per hour not to exceed \$5.00 per month for all bindweed work done by her for the Bindweed Supervisor, said increase to become effective May 1, 1942.

The salary of Al Winter, by approval of all three Commissioners, was increased from \$70.00 to \$80.00 per month.

Mrs. W. O. Nelson, Director of Civilian Defense in the County, gave another report to the Board.

The Board adjourned to meet Thursday, April 2, 1942.
