The Board approved the issuance of a duplicate beer license to Roy Borgen, owner of the Dine-A-Mite Inn due to his original being destroyed by fire.

Bindweed Supervisor, Asa R. Colman, made a report to the Board on the bindweed program as far as it has been carried out this year.

The three members of the Douglas County Rationing Board, namely, Elmer Ousdahl, M. D. Flory and F. O. Eckman and the County Commissioners discussed the consolidation of the five rationing boards as now exist in this county. It was the opinion of the three members of said Rationing Board #1, that it would be best to consolidate all these boards into two boards, one for the county and one for the City of Lawrence. The Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners stated that he would make an effort to get more information on this matter so that it could be discussed further at a later date.

C. T. Hough and a Mr. Warner of the Kansas Electric Power Company suggested to the Commissioners that the current used for the courthouse and jail be changed to a different rate, because of the heavy demand at this time, in an effort to make a saving for the courthouse. In the event such a demand decreased, the county could go back again to the rate it is now using. Such a change met the approval of the Board.

As per adjournment, all members of the Board of County Commissioners, namely, L. H. Griffith, Chairman, J. M. Sanderson and Ed Johnson, Commissioners and T. R. Gerhart, County Clerk, met in the regular meeting rooms of said Board.

With J. W. Stone, City Clerk, the Board discussed the dispensing of Rationing Boards Nos. 3, 4, and 5, in this county. Mr. Stone said that the City would share 50-50 in the expenses for the quarters of the Boards after the new setup is made, their share to be approximately \$10.00 per month.

The following resolution was passed by proper motion, second and unanimous vote of the Board:

RESOLUTION

Pursuant to a letter of instruction from Jeff A. Robertson, State Rationing Administrator, dated April 6, 1942,

BE IT RESOLVED that Rationing Boards No. 3, 4, and 5 be and are hereby discontinued as of this date, and such business as they have heretofore cared for will be cared for by Rationing Board No. 1.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be sent to the State Rationing Administrator and to the chairmen of Rationing Boards No. 3, 4, and 5.

The Board also went on record as to its cooperation with the City in renting offices for the rationing boards in the Lawrence National Bank Building.

Ed Johnson moved that the county, by its Board of County Commissioners, agrees to pay one-half of the rent and incidental expenses of the rooms for the five rationing boards in the Lawrence National Bank Building, which would amount to approximately \$10.00 per month. J. M. Sanderson seconded the motion. On vote, called by Chairman Griffith, all commissioners voted "Aye".

The Commissioners entered into a discussion on the County Health Unit, and in pursuant to same, the following letter received from the Kansas State Board of Health is made a matter of record:
