Also in pursuant to the same project, the following agreement was signed by the Commissioners:

AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT made this 29th day of April, 1942, by and between L. E. Woodard of Eudora, Douglas County, Kansas, party of the first part, and the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, Party of the second part.

WITNESSETH that the said party of the second part, in consideration of the agreements herein-after included, and agreements of the party of the second part hereinafter included, shall have the exclusive right and privilege of entering property of the party of the first part, to construct a new channel for Little Wakarusa Creek.

IN CONSIDERATION of which the said party of the second part agrees to pay the said party of the first part, for crops destroyed, based on the average acreage production at time of harvest, the price per bushel shall be the local market price where the grain is ordinarily sold.

THE SAID PARTY of the second part further agrees to furnish all material and labor, pertinent to placing 150 c yds. of gravel in party of first part driveway.

THE SAID PARTY of the second part further agrees to remove designated trees and dispose of same, as agreed with party of the first part.

THE SAID PARTY of the second part further agrees to drain abandoned channel should it at any time form stagnant pools.

THE SAID PARTY of the second part further agrees to provide a suitable entrance or entrances to farmable land.

The Board of County Commissioners, with all members and the County Clerk present, met in the regular rooms of said Board for the first meeting of the month.

With the authorization of the other members of the Board, the Chairman signed the budget for the County Health Unit. All signed copies were sent to Dr. Henry Asher of the Kansas State Board of Health.

Regular claims against the county were by motion, second and vote, allowed in amounts as recorded in the Allowance Record on file in the office of the County Clerk.

The County Engineer, E. E. Larson, asked for certain wage increases for employees in his department. By approval of the Board the wages of Fred McNish were raised from 35¢ to 40¢ per hour, effective May 1, 1942. The salary of Walt Dimery will be \$65.00 per month, effective May 1, 1942.

Refunding warrant No. 88 was ordered paid. This was made payable to Tom Smart in the amount of \$19.91, on account of duplicate payment on Personal tax Warrant #5011, 1936 tax.

Other salary increases for the Engineering Department went into effect this 1st day of May, namely:
