The need for such a peace officer, they said, was because of the enormous influx of people coming into that vicinity due to the construction of the powder plant. They would like a full-time man stationed at Eudora and said they needed him immediately. The Board informed this delegation that it would have to discuss this matter further with the Sheriff.

However, there was some discussion as to paying more mileage. The Sheriff is interested in getting an experienced man for this job. It was suggested that Pohl be paid the salary of \$125.00 per month plus \$25.00 for mileage. At this time, also, Mr. Banning asked that each of the two deputies in his office receive a salary raise of \$10.00. Action on this was postponed until a later date.

For the first meeting of the month, all members of the Board of County Commissioners and the County Clerk, met in the regular meeting rooms of said Board.

Regular claims against the county for salaries and wages were minutely inspected and by proper motion ordered paid as per amounts recorded in the Allowance Record on file in the office of the County Clerk.

In the matter of the county's establishing Sewer District No. 3, appeared C. E. Hosford. Since the proper procedure calls for the passing of a resolution, the Board asked that this be prepared and presented at its next meeting, so that formal action could be taken.

County Director Mildred LeSuer talked to the Board about a meeting with the officials of the townships, schools and city for the purpose of discussing the apportionment of the sales tax due this county from the state. The Board contemplates allocating all of this sales tax to the Welfare Fund, because of the great need for same.

It was moved by Ed Johnson that a resolution be drawn up regarding the apportionment of the county's share of the sales tax fund, and that a hearing be held on Saturday, June 27, a notice of which is to be duly published in the official county paper. A second was made by J. M. Sanderson.
