Pursuant thereto, the Commissioners adopted the following resolution establishing Sewer District No. 3.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS a Petition has been filed with the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, in accordance with Sec. 19-2704 G. S. 1935 and Amendments thereto, signed by Elizabeth Shaft Erwin, L. R. Hollingsworth and Helen J. Hosford, being the owners of One Hundred Per Cent (100%) of the land acreage in the following described real estate:

- (1) "Beginning at the Southwest corner of the Southeast Quarter of Sec. 6-13-20, thence East on Section Line 4 99/100 chains, thence North parallel with the West boundary of said Quarter Section 4 865/1000 chains, thence West parallel with the South Boundary of said Quarter Section 4 99/100 chains, thence South 4 865/1000 chains to beginning."
- (2) "The South 466 feet of the following described tract, The South $4\frac{1}{2}$ acres of the East 9 acres of the West 19 acres of the South one-half of the Southeast Quarter of Section 6-13-20, less the following--(Beginning at a point on the South boundary of the Southeast Quarter of Section 6-13-20, 5 chains East of the Southwest corner of said quarter section, thence East 100 feet, thence North 230 feet, thence West 100 feet, thence South 230 feet to beginning.)"
- (3) "Beginning at a point on the South boundary of the Southeast Quarter of Section 6-13-20, 5 chains East of the Southwest corner of said Quarter Section, thence East 100 feet, thence North 230 feet, thence West 100 feet, thence South 230 feet to beginning."

requesting that sewer district be formed within the boundaries of the above described real estate, and that a sewer system be constructed therein:

WHEREAS the owners of the land in the proposed district have agreed to pay all of the cost incident to the establishment and construction of said sewer system.

AND WHEREAS a preliminary engineering survey has been made and a finding has been made that said sewer district would be practical and beneficial;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, in regular session assembled, this first day of June, 1942, that said proposed sewer district should be and is hereby created within the boundaries of the above described real estate, and said district to be designated as Sewer District No. 3.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, enter into an agreement with the governing body of the City of Lawrence with respect to the connecting of said sewer with the sewer system of the City of Lawrence in line with the provisions of this resolution;

He asked the Board if it would grant him a leave of absence, so that he would be able to accept this new position. After some deliberation, Ed Johnson moved that E. E. Larson, County Engineer, be granted a leave of absence for one year, beginning June 22, 1942. J. M. Sanderson seconded the motion. Motion carried by unanimous vote.

It was further moved by Ed Johnson that C. E. Redmond serve in the capacity of Acting County Engineer in the absence of E. E. Larson. J. M. Sanderson seconded the motion. On vote, all Commissioners voted "Aye".

For a short meeting on health matters, appeared Dr. H. L. Chambers, Howard Weindel, Sanitation Officer and a Mr. Walker, S.O. and another man from the State office. This delegation asked the Board to consult them before issuing beer licenses to any person or persons in the county. The Board said that the commissioners would be glad to cooperate in any way that they can.

The Board adjourned to meet Monday, June 8, 1942.
