June 11, 1942.

All members of the Board of County Commissioners met in regular adjourned session this 11th day of June, 1942, in the regular meeting room of said Board.

John Linn, FSA Supervisor, asked the Commissioners to furnish the labor for painting the rooms in the courthouse used by the Farm Security Administration, providing the government furnished the paint for the work. The Commissioners approved of this and informed Mr. Linn that the county would bear the expense of the labor used for this painting.

No further business appearing, the Board adjourned to meet Friday, June 12, 1942.

The Board of County Commissioners met as a Board of Equalization for the first day of the final three-day session for 1942. All the members of said Board and the County Clerk were present.

There appeared Chas. Teter to object to the raise of \$635.00 the Board placed on his property during their viewing of said property while in session during the first ten days of the Equalization period. Mr. Teter had asked for a reduction on his property, but after viewing, the Commissioners considered that the valuation was already too low and therefore raised the valuation. Now, Mr. Teter said he would be satisfied if the Board would strike off this increase and leave the assessed valuation remain as placed thereon by the deputy assessors.

Chas Barnes appeared before the Board relative to the increase the Board placed on his property during the first ten-day Equalization period. The Commissioners raised the property \$100.00 because they thought it was out of line. Mr. Barnes said that the valuation placed on this property by the deputy assessors was excessive and that the increase made by the Board made it far out of line. However, the Board's decision was that the valuation should stand as increased.

The Board spent the rest of the day viewing real estate properties.

Adjournment was taken to meet again Friday, June 12, 1942.
