AGREEMENT

This agreement made this 17th day of June, 1942, by and between The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, at Lawrence, Kansas, party of the first part, and Don Kaser and Elmer Kaser, partners doing business as the Kaser Construction Company in the County of Douglas, State of Kansas, party of the second part.

The party of the first part hereby agrees to sell and convey on the 10th day of September, 1942, to the party of the second part, equipment described as follows: One 3/4 yard capacity shovel stick and boom, One 35 foot steel latticed boom, One 5/8 yard capacity drag line bucket, One 3/4 capacity drag line bucket, One 5/8 yard capacity clam shell; in consideration of which said party of the second part agrees to pay to the party of the first part the sum of \$3,540.00 upon delivery of said equipment.
