All members of the Board of County Commissioners and the County Clerk met in regular adjourned session in the regular meeting rooms of said Board.

The Commissioners requested that all road employees work Saturday afternoons until the 1st of er and beginning August 1 with an increase in wages of \$10.00 per month for this period. This \$10.00 per month increase also includes the clerk at the county shops.

The hourly wage of Mrs. Mildred LeSuer, Accountant, was increased from 75¢ to 90¢ per hour, effective July 1, 1942.

Quarterly reports were presented to the Board for its approval, and after so being approved, were placed on file in the office of the County Clerk.

The Court Reporter's fees report was presented to the Board by John Callahan, Clerk of the District Court and duly signed by the Chairman of the Board.

Bids for a new boiler for the courthouse were received from The Lawrence Iron Works by Leonard Deay Ruesch, from Olson Bros. and the Kennedy Plumbing Company.

The bid of the Lawrence Iron Works was accepted. Such bid is as follows:

"In regard to the proposed installation of a new low pressure coal, hand fired steam heating boiler in the Douglas County Court House; please be advised that we have checked and tabulated the existing radiation in the Court House and find a total of approximately 3500 square feet of installed radiation. We propose to handle the existing radiation load plus the estimated pipe loss and customary pick up allowance for rapid heating.

We propose to perform the following work; 1-Remove the existing heating boiler from the building site, the existing boiler and brick work to become our property. 2-Furnish and install complete with insulation and in operating order one new Pacific Low Pressure Steel Welded Heating Boiler having a Steel Heating Boiler Institute Rating of 6000 square feet of Equivalent Direct Radiation when fired with coal by hand. Existing return main shall be connected to the new boiler through a Hartford Loop. The above for the sum of \$1,690.00 (Sixteen Hundred Ninety and no/100 Dollars.)

The boiler manufacturer states that shipment can be made from the factory between the 1st and 15th of September, 1942. Installation can be completed in approximately ten days after delivery of the boiler to the building.

The above proposal includes the installation of a new boiler only. Any required work on piping or radiation outside of the boiler room proper shall, if performed by us, be handled as a separate
