an approved purchase order in favor of the party of the first part, in the amount of \$300.00, which will be charged to the 1942 budget and cash balances, of the County General Fund, which will be payable according to and within the limitations set by the sixth paragraph of this agreement.

(9) On January 2, 1943, the party of the second part agrees to issue a purchase order in favor of the party of the first part in the amount of \$675.00, which will be charged to the 1943 budget and cash balances of the County General Fund, and which will be payable according to and within the transformer of the county of the limitations of the sixth paragraph of this agreement.

Provided however, that where this agreement refers to work to be done during the period January 1, 1943 to June 30, 1943, the agreement shall not be in full force or effect until January 3, 1943. (10)
