COMMISSIONER'S RECORD N

(e) To supervise and direct investigations and report to the governing bodies of the city and county and the State Defense Council with recommendations for legislation or other appropriate action as it may deem necessary with respect to type of activity or matter of public concern or welfare insofar as the same is or may be related to defense.

(f) To create committees, either within or without its membership, to aid in the discharge of its powers and duties.

(g) To require and direct the cooperation and assistance of the agencies and officials of the City of Lawrence and County of Douglas.

(h) To do all acts and things, not inconsistent with law, for the furtherance of defense activities.

UTILIZATION OF EXISTING SERVICES AND FACILITIES

All departments, officers, offices, commissions, boards, bureaus, institutions, and other agencies of the City and County shall cooperate with and extend their services and facilities to the local council.

TERMINATION OF LOCAL COUNCIL

The City and County Local Council of Defense shall terminate or cease activity whenever the State Council of Defense is dissolved or suspended.
