

COMMISSIONER'S RECORD N

September 1, 1942.

At the hour of 9 o'clock a. m., the Board of County Commissioners and the County Clerk present, met in regular session in the regular meeting rooms of said Board.

Regular claims against the county for salaries and wages were presented to the Board, minutely inspected and by proper motion allowed in amounts as recorded on the Allowance Record on file in the office of the County Clerk.

The Board increased the salary of Pearl Dicker, Clerk in the office of the County Clerk, from \$80.00 per month to \$90.00 per month, effective September 1, 1942.

John Lynn, FSA Supervisor, discussed the employment of a stenographer for his office. He informed the Board that he was unable to get a girl less than \$75.00 per month, and asked if the Commissioners would approve employing Melba Reetz at this salary. The Board approved the employment of said Melba Reetz at the salary of \$75.00 per month, effective September 1, 1942.

The distribution of the Primary election expenses, as set up by the County Clerk, was approved by the Board and copies of same were duly signed by the Chairman of said Board.

It was moved by Ed Johnson that a Mr. Hamell be employed to drill a well at the County Farm and to pull the casing out of the drilled well on the south side of the road. Said Mr. Hamell is to be paid for pulling the casing from the well at the rate of \$25.00 per day. It is further agreed that he shall be paid \$1.50 per foot and shall insert the casing in the newly drilled well free of charge, said well to be drilled on the north side of the road. A second was made by J. M. Sanderson. On vote, all Commissioners voted "Aye".

The Board adjourned to meet Friday, September 4, 1942.

The Commissioners, sitting as a Board, met at the hour of 9 o'clock a. m. in regular adjourned session, there being present, also, County Clerk T. R. Gerhart.

Further bills against the county for wages, materials and supplies were by unanimous vote ordered paid in amounts as recorded on the Allowance Record in the office of the County Clerk.

The Sheriff discussed the payment of the claims of Wayne Owens and Ernest Pohl, former deputies in his department. After a discussion, the Board allowed the claim of Owens in the full amount allowing him time for vacation, due to his having returned to the Sheriff's office for work even after he had accepted another position. The Board did not allow the vacation time for Pohl, because at the time of his termination of employment with the county, he accepted another position and did not nor intended to return to the county for further work.

Alice Wells, deputy in the office of the Clerk of the District Court, was allowed \$15.00 overtime for work done on the Judicial Tax Sale. Her voucher called for \$65.00 rather than the regular \$50.00.

A request for property adjustment was made by Glenn Allen. The Board informed him that nothing could be done at this time, and that he should make his appearance before the Board of Equalization when it met on the third Monday in May.

The Board adjourned to meet Tuesday, September 8, 1942, Monday being a holiday.
