

## COMMISSIONER'S RECORD N

## A G R E E M E N T

THIS AGREEMENT, made this 2nd day of Oct., 1942, by and between the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, party of the first part, and Harry Woodring, party of the second part,

WITNESSETH: That said party of the first part, in consideration of the agreements of the party of the second part hereinafter stated, agrees and covenants with the said party of the second part to purchase gravel located on premises owned by party of the second part described as follows, to-wit:

Northeast Quarter of Section 12, Township 12 S,  
Range 18 E, in Douglas County, Kansas.

Party of the first part further agrees to pay party of the second part the sum of ten cents (10¢) per cubic yard for all gravel taken from said premises, which is to be used on County and Township roads.

Party of the first part further agrees to construct a road on the premises owned by the party of the second part from the top of the hill on said premises direct to the Township road, a distance of approximately three-quarter mile.

IN CONSIDERATION OF WHICH the party of the second part agrees to allow party of the first part to take any and all gravel from said premises, which said party of the first part desires to purchase, and party of the second part further agrees that said gravel will not be sold to any third party if party of the first part desires to purchase it.

Party of the second part further agrees to furnish, free of charge, the gravel necessary to construct a road on his own premises.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties to this Agreement have hereunto set their hands the day and year above written.
