For \$1400, legally issued Special Assessment Sewer bonds of Douglas County delivered to us in Topeka, Kansas, dated January 1st, 1943, and to mature \$200 Jan. 1st 1945 to 1951 inclusive, Interest to begin Jan. 1st, 1943, first coupon due Jan. 1st, 1944 and semi-annually thereafter, said bonds to be of the denomination of \$200, bearing interest at the rate of 2½% per annum, payable semi-annually, both principal and interest payable at state Fiscal Agency. WE WILL PAY Par and accrued interest. We agree to furnish transcript, printed bonds and take care of registration with the state auditor. You agree to allow us \$50.00 for printing and preparation of the transcript.

These bonds are to be delivered within 60 days and thereafter at our option. This bid is made expressly and subject to the approval by some reputable and disinterested attorney selected or approved by us, of the legality of said bonds and the taxation provisions relating thereto, you agreeing to furnish us promptly and prior to the delivery of said bonds a full certified transcript of all proceedings had incident to the issuance of said bonds, and to furnish such other certificates and take such further action, if any, as such attorney may reasonably request.

We hand you herewith our certified check or draft for \$_____ as evidence of our good faith in complying with the terms and conditions of this bid, which is to apply as part payment of said bonds when the legality of same has been approved by our attorney, and to be forfeited as liquidated damages should we fail or refuse to take up said bonds as above provided. Said check or draft to be returned to us if this bid is not accepted, or if our attorneys should decline to approve the legality of this issue.

The Commissioners discussed the replacement of the motor at the Eckman Well with the County Engineer. Mr. Eckman has informed the Board that he is in need of this well and that he will be responsible for the expenses connected with the operation of same. Therefore, J. M. Sanderson moved that the County Engineer be instructed to replace the motor at the Eckman Well for the use of said Mr. F. O. Eckman who agrees to be responsible for the upkeep and maintenance of said motor during the period of his using same; and that he further agrees to pay for all the electricity used for the operation of the well. Ed Johnson seconded the motion. On vote, all Commissioners voted in the affirmative.

There appeared J. F. Laughlin asking the County Board to do something about a drainage problem on a certain road in Palmyra Township, said road being adjacent to the farm of Mr. Laughlin. He said that the drainage facilities on this road are not sufficient, that the ditch is too shallow and that the water has always flooded the road. It was agreed that the Commissioners with the County Engineer would meet with Mr. Laughlin and other interested parties at this particular place in Section 15-14-20, Palmyra Township, same being just south of the Vinland School House, on Tuesday, December 29 at 2 o'clock p. m.

No further business appearing, the Board adjourned to meet Tuesday, December 29, 1942.
