In view of the Allen Press being the low bidder, M. N. Penny moved that the contract for the furnishing of assessment supplies as per specifications for the year 1943, be awarded to the Allen Press at their total bid price of \$207.00, delivered. Ed Johnson seconded the motion. On vote, all Commissioners voted "Aye".

The recommendation of Mrs. Margaret Hurley, County Superintendent of Schools, for the attachment of certain described property lying in Johnson County, for school purposes was approved by the Board.

Again, the matter of concession rights at the Lone Star Park was considered as per the proposal of A. S. Eliot. It was moved by Ed Johnson and seconded by M. N. Penny that Mr. Eliot be permitted to reduce his payments on said concession rights at the Lone Star Park to \$75.00 per year for the year of 1943. Said motion carried by unanimous vote.

Ernest Klooz appeared before the Commissioners with Milton P. Beach, County Attorney, to discuss the matter of Klooz' salary. No action was taken this day.

By proper motion and second the salary of Bernice Davis, employed in the Treasurer's office, was increased to \$80.00 per month, that of Mary Ellen Simmons in same department, to \$80.00 per month and that of Robert Boener, also of that department, to \$90.00 per month, all increases to become effective the 1st of February, 1943. Said motion carried.

By formal action, the salary of Leonard Williams, in the Engineering Department, was decreased from \$145.00 to \$140.00 per month, and that of Raymond Erubaker was increased from \$125.00 to \$130.00 per month, both to become effective February 1, 1943.

Bids for the gasoline requirements for the county for the year beginning February 1, 1943 to December 31, 1943, were received at this time. Two propositions were submitted, No. 1 for the furnishing of Douglas County's gasoline requirements for the designated period on tank wagon delivery to county equipment any place in Douglas County without Federal tax, but with state tax included; and Proposition No. 2 for tank wagon delivery to county equipment any place in Douglas County at a unit price based on Certified refinery costs, plus Certified freight costs plus a handling charge.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Counties are directed by Section 79-2801 to 79-2807 G. S., 1935, Supp. of 1937, to file a foreclosure suit and sell lands, which have been carried on the tax rolls for a certain number of years, without having had the taxes paid thereon;

AND WHEREAS, there are numerous parcels of land on the tax rolls of Douglas County, which have been carried on the rolls of this county without having said taxes paid thereon, which would be subject to the judicial sale referred to above;
