AND WHEREAS, it is the desire of the said Douglas County to proceed to sell the said property and place the land back on the tax rolls on a paying basis;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the County Attorney of Douglas County be instructed as provided by law to proceed with the judicial sale as directed by the sections above mentioned and to institute and carry out to completion the said proceeding.

The above resolution was presented and discussed by the members of the Douglas County Board. It was moved by Mr. M. N. Penny and seconded by Mr. Ed Johnson that the resolution be adopted.

The resolution was carried by a unanimous vote.

M. N. Penny moved that the County Clerk be instructed to deduct the victory tax from salary and wages of all persons employed by the county, according to the Federal law, and that the straight 5% basis be used. Ed Johnson seconded the motion. Motion carried by unanimous vote.

The Board discussed with Ernest Klooz the possibility of his taking care of the delinquent tax sales and operate the addressograph. Mr. Klooz agreed to work at the two jobs for \$140.00 per month, beginning February 1, 1943, until July 1, 1943; at that time his salary would be raised to \$145.00 per month. Such an agreement was accepted by the Board of County Commissioners.

All members of the Board of County Commissioners, namely: L. H. Griffith, Chairman, Ed Johnson and M. N. Penny, Commissioners, and T. R. Gerhart, County Clerk, met in the regular meeting rooms of the Board for the first meeting of the month.

The County Clerk presented to the Board, regular bills for salaries and wages; and after close scrutiny by the Commissioners, by proper motion, same were allowed in amounts as recorded on the Allowances Record in the office of the County Clerk.

Clerk of Court, John Callahan appeared before the Commissioners, requesting that the salary of his clerk, Alice Wells, be increased from \$50.00 to \$65.00 per month. After some discussion, the request was granted by motion of M. N. Penny, seconded by Ed Johnson and by unanimous vote. Miss Wells is to receive the salary of \$65.00 per month, beginning February 1, 1943, with the provision that said clerk is to work eight hours per day in the office.

County Treasurer, Roy Flory, requested the Board to allow him extra help in his office because of the heavy volume of work at this time. It was moved by M. N. Penny that the County Treasurer be allowed to employ two extra people in his office to take care of the extra work. There being no objection, it was so ordered.

Minutes for the meeting of January 27, were read and approved as read.

The Board adjourned to meet Wednesday, February 3, 1943.

Further bills against the county for supplies and materials were allowed by proper motion, second and vote.

No further business appearing, the Board adjourned to meet Wednesday, February 10, 1943.
