All members being present, the Board of County Commissioners and the County Clerk convened in regular adjourned session.

Ed Johnson seconded the motion. On vote, called by Chairman Griffith, all Commissioners voted in the affirmative.

In regular adjourned session this day, there convened in the regular meeting rooms of the Board, all members of the Board of County Commissioners, namely, L. H. Griffith, Chairman, Ed Johnson and M. N. Penny, Commissioners, and County Clerk T. R. Gerhart.

Harold K. Snider, Highway Commissioner of the First Division, appeared before the Board for the purpose of discussing Bill No. 248, pertaining to the gasoline tax fund and the percentage of allotment to the townships and counties. Formerly, 40% of this had been prorated back to the townships and counties, but this new bill calls for a 25% division. Up to this time, the County Board had been opposed to this new Bill.
