Mr. Penny reported to the Board the action that was taken at a meeting of the City Council, at which meeting said Mr. Penny and Mr. Johnson attended, in regard to the county's and the city's share of the expenses of the local Rationing Board. Since it is necessary to acquire additional space for the rationing offices, it was proposed to use the south part of the bases of the Community Fuilding for this purpose. The rental of \$60.00 per month was set up as being fair and reasonable, such rental to include heat, water, light and janiter service. In order to ready this additional office space for occupancy, it is necessary that certain improvements be made, such as temporary petitions, handrails and counters. It was agreed between the commissioners, representing the Board of County Commissioners and the City Council that the City would pay 60% of the eest of such improvements and the County pay 40% of same. This expense shall be paid monthly by the City and the County until the lst of July, 1943. Thereafter, the proportion of expense shall be paid by the City and County on the basis of population of said City to that of the remainder of the County, same to be determined by the records in the office of the County Clerk, and will be paid on this basis of population for such time as the Rationing Board shall continue to ccupy said space in the Community Building.

A written agreement to this effect will be drawn up by the City Attorney and presented to the City Council and Board of Commissioners at a later date for action thereon.

The following resolution designating the depositories for the county officials was passed as follows:

RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE FOLLOWING COUNTY OFFICIALS OF DOUGLAS COUNTY, KANSAS, TO DEPOSIT ALL MONIES RECEIVED BY THEM IN THEIR OFFICIAL CAPACITIES IN THE BANKS AS DESIGNATED AS FOLLOWS:

WHEREAS, it is required that the Board of County Commissioners comply with Section 9-303-303 General Statutes of Kansas, 1935, designating depositories for all public monies received by county officials in their official capacities.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners, Douglas County, Kansas, in regular session this 1st day of April, 1943, that all county officials named herein deposit all public monies received by them in their official capacities in the banks as designated below, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all banks so listed below shall be the depositories in which monies shall be deposited by said officials of Douglas County, Kansas;

County Clerk T. R. Gerhart, approached the matter of increasing the salary of the janitor, Harold Wilburn, based on his efficiency to the courthouse. After a short discussion, the Board was in agreement as follows: Ed Johnson moved that the salary of Harold Wilburn, Janitor, be increased from \$100.00 to \$110.00 per month, beginning the first of April, 1943, such compensation to be in effect until the first of September. M. N. Penny seconded the motion. On vote, called by Chairman Griffith, all Commissioners voted "Aye".

Roy Hegeman, General Foreman of the Road and Bridge Department, discussed the matter of using county equipment in doing work for private parties. Due to the shortage of help in this department, and to the lack of sufficient gasoline as well as the fact that the county has no priority rating if the equipment should break down on private property, the Board does not feel that the county should take on any private work at this time.

Therefore, M. N. Penny moved that the county do no outside work other then that necessary to the county until further notice. Ed Johnson seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Since the Board is interested in purchasing a new stove for the county home, there appeared Everett Christenson to interest the county in purchasing a stove which is used for artificial gas. This can be purchased in bottles or may be delivered and placed in underground tanks. No action was taken by the Board this day.

Ad journment was taken to meet again, Monday, April 5, 1943.
