The County Clerk presented the bids for furnishing of election supplies for the Special election to be held on September 14, 1943.

In view of the above, Ed Johnson moved that the bid submitted by the World Company in the amount of \$143.00 for the furnishing of supplies for the special election in September, be accepted, they being the low bidder. By proper second and vote, the motion carried.

The following agreement was signed by the Board and Hubert Moodie :

A G R E E M E N T

THIS AGREEMENT made this 11th day of August, 1943, by and between Hubert Moodie of Lawrence, Douglas County, Kansas, party of the first part, and the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, party of the second part:

WITNESSETH that the said party of the first part in consideration of the sum of \$1.00, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, and the agreements of the party of the second part herein-after stated, agrees that the party of the second part shall have the exclusive right and privilege for five (5) years from the date hereof to purchase all limestone gravel that it may desire which is located on the real estate owned by the said party of the first part, being described as follows, to-wit:

N¹/₂ of SE¹/₄ of Section 26, Twp. 13 S, Range 19 E

IN CONSIDERATION of which the said party of the second part agrees to pay the said party of the first part the sum of four cents (4¢) for each and every cubic yard purchased by the said party of the second part.

THE SAID PARTY of the second part further agrees to provide all necessary equipment and labor to remove the gravel and to haul it away.

THE PARTY of the first part agrees to allow the party of the second part a convenient right-of-way from the gravel deposits to a public highway, the party of the second part to provide equipment and labor in constructing the road from the gravel pit to a public highway.

THE PARTY of the first part agrees that none of the gravel on the above mentioned real estate will be sold to any other person, firm, or corporation during the time this contract is in effect without the consent of the party of the second part.

THE PARTY of the second part to have the option of renewing the agreement at the expiration of the time of this agreement, if it so desires.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF the parties to this agreement have hereunto set their hands the day and year first above written.

All members of the Board of County Commissioners, namely: L. H. Griffith, Chairman, Ed Johnson, and M. N. Penny, Commissioners, with the County Clerk T. R. Gerhart, met in regular adjourned session.

The formal hearing for the 1944 budget was scheduled for the hour of 10 o'clock a. m., but no person or persons appeared to make any comment on same. Therefore, after some lapse of time, M. N. Penny moved that the Board approve the budget as set up for 1944. Ed Johnson seconded the motion. On vote, motion carried by unanimous vote.

Mr. Blair of the local telephone company and Mr. Harold Pheasant, Right-of-Way representative from Topeka, appeared before the Board in regard to the contemplated road vacation of old Road No. 593 in Eudora Township, on which is situated the old Moody Bridge. The road notice for vacating about a quarter mile of this road has been published and the Board will view same on September 7. The representatives from the SW Bell Telephone Company said they had no objection to the vacation of this section of the road since their company has a right-of-way pass there.

No further business appearing, the Board adjourned to meet August 25, 1943.
