RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, it has come to the attention of the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, State of Kansas, that a traffic hazard does exist through the town of Clinton, situated in Clinton Township, in said county and state; in that vehicles traveling through said town exceed a reasonable speed limit, thereby endangering the lives and property of pedestrians, and

WHEREAS, the route of travel taken by such vehicles is pass a public school and is a detriment to the safety of school children, and

WHEREAS, the Board has been requested to take some action to correct the situation as it now exists.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of County Commissioners that traffic signs be set up at pertinent points in the town of Clinton; namely, 300 feet east and west of the school yards on the county road in the NW 1/4 of Section 3-13-18, and that the speed limit for traveling through said town be set at 15 miles per hour.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Engineering Department of said county be instructed to locate the signs as ordered.
