"CANCEL Intangible tax in the amount of \$28.90, based on a valuation of \$5780.00, charged to Kathryn M. Corcoran, 1401 Mass. Street, Lawrence, Kansas. City of Lawrence 1943 Tax Roll, Page 361, Line 15.

This will leave an Intangible valuation of \$60.00 with a tax of 30¢ on the rolls.

As per the statement attached, Miss Corcoran actually had on hand the first of March, \$58.41, instead of \$5,841.00."

In regular adjourned meeting this 16th day of February, 1944, there met in the regular meeting rooms of the Board of County Commissioners, all members of said Board and the County Clerk.

The following Commissioners' Orders were passed by the Board:

No. 331: "CANCEL grain tax in the amount of 12¢, levied against 235 bushels of grain, charged to the Federal Land Bank, Wichita, Kansas. Willow Springs 1932 Tax Roll, Page 192, Line 31.

CANCEL grain tax in the amount of 20¢ plus interest and penalties of 12¢ (Total 32¢) on 390 bushels of grain, charged to A. L. Brown (Federal Land Bank). Wakarusa Tax Roll for 1942, Page 288, Line 32, School District #29.

Cancellation made by authority of blanket Order from the State Commission of Revenue and Taxation, with reference to the Federal Act of January 31, 1934 and that of July 17, 1916, directing all counties to cancel any personal property on tax rolls charged against the Federal Land Banks or Federal Farm Mortgage Corporation."

No. 332: "CANCEL tax in the amount of \$1.15, based on an Intangible valuation of \$230.00, charged to Julia Martin, 714 McCook Street, Lawrence, Kansas. School District #60. Page 405, Line 21 of City of Lawrence 1943 Tax Roll. Also, issue refund check in the above amount.

ENTER on the 1943 Subsequent Tax Roll for the City of Lawrence, S. D. #60, tax in the amount of \$7.65, based on an Intangible valuation of \$1530.00, charged to Julia Martin, Admx. of Julia H. Kerns Estate, 714 McCook, Lawrence, Kansas.

The former assessment of \$230.00 was also included in the assessment of \$1530.00, therefore, in order to correct the double assessment, this Order is made."

The following resolution was passed, ordering the issuance of a Beer license to Robert Taylor, Grant Township:

R E S O L U T I O N

WHEREAS, on the 16th day of February, 1944, the same being a regular adjourned meeting of the Board of County Commissioners, the application of Robert Taylor for a beer license came on for consideration of said Board, and

WHEREAS, the Board does find that the said Robert Taylor is in all ways qualified under the law to sell cereal malt beverages for consumption on the premises, and

WHEREAS, the Board further finds that due and legal notice has been given to the Grant Township Board and that ten days have expired from the giving of said notice, and that no written objection has been filed by the Grant Township Board, protesting the granting of a beer license.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the applicant Robert Taylor be granted a license to sell cereal malt beverages for consumption on premises at the place so described in application.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that T. R. Gerhart, County Clerk of Douglas County, be, and he is hereby directed to issue said license.
