IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that this property is to be operated as a convalescent hospital, only, and that no person or persons adjudged to be insane by the court and is now an inmate of or eligible for commitment to a state hospital for the insane, shall be admitted to the county's convalescent hospital for care; and only such persons who have been declared cured and discharged from a state hospital either by the board of administration or by a court of competent jurisdiction, shall be considered for admission to the convalescent hospital.
