July 12, 1944.

The Board of County Commissioners met in regular adjourned session, all members of the Board being present.

E. E. Larson, County Engineer, reported jetties on Kaw River, near Eudora, were destroyed or damaged by fire. The origin of the fire is undetermined, but some party had been burning debris on South side of the road.

There was some discussion as to compensating Mrs. Otis Lindell for her work in cleaning the cabins at the Lone Star Park. Mrs. Lindell, wife of the Park Superintendent, does not feel she can continue to do this work unless she receives something for her services. This matter was given due consideration, then action was taken by the following motion:

Ed Johnson moved that for her services in cleaning certain cabins at the lake, Mrs. Lindell be allowed 20% of the proceeds from the "day by day" rented cottages at Lone Star Park, the money to be paid to her when the money from the rentals is turned in to the County Engineer's office. M. N. Penny seconded the motion. On vote called by Chairman L. H. Griffith, all commissioners voted "aye".

As per road notice properly advertised, the members of the County Road, with the County and Asst. County Engineer, met at the hour of 2 P.M. at the place of beginning of the following described road to hear arguments for or against the location of said road, said location being petitioned for by Albert Brune, et al:

Beginning at a point approximately 2300 feet West of the Southeast corner of Section 10, Township 12 S, Range 19 E., thence Northerly along the East line of Lake View property, and through School grounds to Railroad, and across Railroad; thence Northerly along high ground on the East side of the old Lake bed to a point in old Road No. 489.

A number of interested parties present, both for and against the location of the road; although those against the road voiced their objections emphatically, while those in favor of the location made few comments. However it was apparent that some arguments were made without the parties having full knowledge of the situation. No decision on the road matter was made at this time.

The County agreed to dig ditch across the field for Seymour Gentry with County Equipment, at the charge of \$1.50 per hour. The ditch was to follow the natural drainage ravine. This will help protect the county road from excess water.

The Board reconvened in the Commissioner's room.
No further business the Board adjourned to meet July 19th.
