

COMMISSIONER'S RECORD N

Douglas County Republican, Lawrence

Since the Board has granted the road, Wakarusa Township will build it and obtained the permission of the Board to use the County Shovel and one of the men from the Engineer's office to run it. The estimated cost of the new road would be approximately \$1000.00

The Board agreed to raise the county road and fix the bridge along Mary Farley's farm, and equalizers will be placed on each side of the bridge.

The paving and improving of Louisiana Street was also discussed at this joint meeting of the two boards, and Wakarusa Township board agreed to grade the entire strip to be paved if the City would pay for one half, and then let the contract for the paving, or if this is not agreeable to the City, the township board agreed to do their part. In either event, the township board is to be present at the time of letting the contract for the paving of said Louisiana Street from 19th Street South to 23rd Street.

The Wakarusa Township Board also reported that it was now agreeable with them to have West Hills District taken into the City on the condition that Fairfax and Belmont Additions be taken in at the same time. This would enlarge the city considerably. It was also agreed that all that district lying South of 15th Street Southeast of the city of Lawrence, south to 23rd Street, and East to Haskell Avenue be taken into the City.

A letter was written to the Mayor of the City, and the City Council informing the City of the approval of the Wakarusa Township and the Board of County Commissioners of such additions to the City of Lawrence.

The Board adjourned to meet October 4th.

The Board ordered re-wiring in the Court House to eliminate the present overload of certain circuits, the wiring to be done as set out in the proposal made by Kennedy Bros. on December 29th, 1942, at the estimated cost of \$200.00.

On motion of Ed Johnson, seconded by M.N. Penny and unanimous vote, L. H. Griffith, Chairman of the Board, issued a refunding Warrant, No. 91, to Eugene P. Sisson, in the amount of \$25.34, on account of Duplicate payment of 1941 Tax, his tax paid on Current tax receipt No. 3545, 1st half on January 21, 1942 and second half on July 20, 1942. Also redeemed through Clerk of District Court Tax foreclosure proceedings on July 30, 1942.

No further business, the board adjourned to meet October 11th.
