

COMMISSIONER'S RECORD N

Douglas County Republican, Lawrence

Mrs. Seba Eldridge asked the Commissioners for authority to order \$600.00 of T. B. X-Ray equipment through the County. After some discussion, and the point being made clear that the T.B. Association would pay for the equipment, the board granted Mrs. Eldridge the permission to purchase the equipment.

The representatives of the KEP presented an estimate for lighting for the offices on the first and second floor as follows:

County Clerk's vault
Judge Mean's office
Small office East of Judge Mean's office
Hall
Clerk of Court office
Clerk of Court vault
Superintendent of Schools office (2 rooms)
County Court Room (2 offices)
County Attorney's office (2 rooms)

Reporter's desk and Judge's desk in Court room, making 32 units, at a total cost of \$1277.43. Mr. Penny moved the estimate be accepted and the lighting ordered. Mr. Johnson seconded the motion, and on vote called the motion carried.

Mr. Larson, County Engineer, reported that he had let the contract for the reinforcing steel for the County farm bridge, to the Construction Products Company, @ \$3.40 per 100 lbs. The plan for the bridge originally set up provided for 1/2 inch square bars; but the WPE would not approve the plan with the square bars, so 5/8 inch round bars will be used in place of the square bars.

No further action was taken in connection with the beer applicants. It was agreed to have Mr. Riling, the County Attorney dictate a letter to be inclosed with the beer licenses when they have been approved by the board, on Tuesday, January 2nd.

J.E. Wilson, Probate Judge, appeared in regard to the County Court which starts Monday, January 8th. Mr. Penny and Mr. Griffith reported that Judge Means of the District Court, has notified the Commissioners that under the law, a clerk or office help cannot be hired for the County Court, as the County Court is under the jurisdiction of the Probate Court, and the Probate Judge is by virtue of his office, also the judge of the County Court and Clerk of the County Court. After considerable discussion the Commissioners asked Mr. Wilson to meet with them again on January 2nd, at 11 o'clock at which time, Mr. Riling, the County Attorney will be present.

The Board adjourned until Tuesday, January 2nd, 1945.

After considerable discussion with J. J. Riling, County Attorney, and R. Skinner, Sheriff, the board granted the remaining applications for renewal of beer licenses per the following resolutions:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, on the 2nd day of January, 1945, the same being a regular adjourned meeting of the Board of County Commissioners, the application of Roy G. Borgen for a beer license came on for consideration of said Board, and

WHEREAS, the Board does find that the said Roy G. Borgen is in all ways qualified under the law to sell cereal malt beverages for consumption on the premises, and

WHEREAS, the Board further finds that due and legal notice has been given to the Wakarusa Township Board and that ten days have expired from the giving of said notice, and that no written objection has been filed by the Wakarusa Township Board, protesting the granting of a beer license.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the applicant, Roy G. Borgen, be granted a license to sell cereal malt beverages for consumption on premises at the place so described in application.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED That T. R. Gerhart, County Clerk of Douglas County, be and he is hereby directed to issue said license.
